Dear Parents and Carers,

The children have settled very well into their new school term and this term will see the start of two new projects.

The first is the 'Safe at school anti bullying award'. This nationwide award is recognised as a mark of high quality and once awarded, the accreditation last for three years. The programme is aligned with Department for Education guidance, equality legislation and Ofsted requirements. Schools and other settings that register, work towards and gain accredited status are publicly demonstrating their commitment to creating a safe, inclusive and accepting school environment where pupil and staff well-being is paramount and unacceptable behaviours are not tolerated. We believe that behaviour has greatly improved at the school, however by embedding a whole school approach and the ethos that is needed to achieve the award we also hope to demonstrate a positive impact in attendance, attainment and well-being, along with a strong partnership with parents.

The second project to start this term will be the whole school review of homework, looking at how we can make home learning both effective and engaging. Homework in the primary years continues to be a high profile issue and I hope to be able to work with all stakeholders on this important aspect of school life. In recent weeks the school has been fortunate to build on its number of volunteers to assist with listening to pupils read regularly. 
