I would like to thank parents for making sure their children come to school dressed as smartly as they are. There is, as with all things, one or two who perhaps are wearing items of foot wear which is either not safe or does not met the school uniform requirements. We ask parents to ensure their child is in sensible footwear, this does not mean items of fashionwear or boots. Your help with this would be appreciated.




