1. On 31 August 2016 to all pupils in Years 7, 8, 9, 11 and some sixth formers.

2. On 31 August 2017 to Year 10 and the Sixth Form students who will complete the second year of their programme of study in the next academic year (the only exception to this is those studying Hair and Beauty who will transfer to Folkestone Academy).
