PARKING OUTSIDE SCHOOL!

Over the course of the past week I have received several complaints from parents and local residents regarding the poor parking outside school. A member of staff even had to endure foul language directed at her while escorting children to the school bus, because parking nearer to the school was considered more important than the safety of children!

Thank you to those drivers who support the safety of our school community by driving and parking responsibly. May I remind families:

- Do not park on the zigzags
 Do not park on single or double yellow lines
- Do not park on the pavements or near the entrances to the school (including the bus stop area).

This is to ensure that children and adults can safely navigate their way to and from school. It is also as a sign of respect to our neighbours on Fairfield Road – who show endless patience with the minority of parents still deciding to park dangerously. Please consider the impact of your parking. Once again I know that the VAST majority of our families are considerate when collecting and dropping children off – thank you.
