#### **School Games Mark Success**

We are delighted to have been awarded the Sainsbury's Silver Games Mark. The School Games Mark is an awards scheme which rewards schools for their commitment to the development of competition across their school. OfSTED use the Mark award as part of their inspection framework and schools can use it as a development tool to improve the quality of access and provision of sport across the school.



To achieve SILVER LEVEL schools must meet all of the prerequisites as well as the following:

- provide all students with two hours of physical education and school sport per week (made up of curricular and extra-curricular activity)
- engage at least 35% of students in extracurricular sporting activity every week
- regularly feature match reports and competition results on the school website and in the local press

The aim now is to apply for the Gold Standard this school year.
