Dear Parents and Carers,

As part of our PSHE curriculum and our continuing work to develop all children's social, emotional and behavioural skills we are taking part in Anti Bullying Week all this week, 14 - 18 November.

Our week of activities will coincide with National Anti-Bullying Week and will shine a light on bullying, sending a clear message that it is neither acceptable nor inevitable in a school community.

The Department for Education defines bullying as "Behaviour by an individual or group, repeatedly over time, that intentionally hurts another individual or group". Bullying can take many forms including:

#### Physical, Verbal, Emotional, Sexual, Homophobic and Cyber

Sadly, bullying takes place in all communities. The life of a victim of bullying can be made a misery: it undermines their confidence and selfesteem. Bullying impacts on a victim's attendance and attainment at school and can have a lifelong negative impact on young people's lives. National Anti-Bullying week has clear aims:

- To support young people to use their 'power for good' by understanding the ways in which they are powerful and can put a stop to bullying.
- To encourage individual and collective action to stop bullying and create the best world possible.
- To help parents and carers to support children with issues relating to bullying, working together with schools to stop bullying.
- For schools to create safe environments where students can thrive.

At St Nicholas we are committed to providing a caring, friendly and safe environment for all members of our community. Bullying of any kind is unacceptable. If bullying does occur, all pupils should have the confidence to tell someone they trust and to be confident that will be dealt with promptly.

During the week, children's timetables may change slightly. All their lessons will have a focus on helping pupils to develop the skills, understanding and confidence to recognise and act when they see or experience bullying. The lessons will be varied and involve the children in many fun activities linked to the anti-bullying theme.
