

Primary School Applications for September 2017

If your child was born between 1st September 2012 and 31st August 2013 you must complete and submit your primary school application by **Monday 16th January 2017**. You need to apply either using the online process available at www.kent.gov.uk/ola or by completing a paper form called a Reception Common Application Form (RCAF). This form can be downloaded from www.kent.gov.uk/primaryadmissions or by contacting KCC Primary Admissions Team.

Even if you already have an older child at the school you MUST apply for a place for your younger child. You will not automatically receive a place because you already have a sibling here.

Entering and exiting school.

Starting tomorrow **Tuesday 29th November** there will be a change to the arrangements as to how the children will be allowed to enter and leave the school at the start and the end of the school day.

On Tuesday children and parents will only be able to enter the school via the KS2 playground double gates. This change has come about is as a result of a review of the schools risk assessments and it is believed it will be best to have only one point of entry and exit for the safety of the pupils.

We will use the KS2 double gate; hopefully this will reduce the risk of congestion. There will also be a member of the schools SLT on duty each day to welcome children and families onto the school site while monitoring the access. We believe this access point will also prove to be much safer for our children and families providing there is no-one parking on the zigzags, as it will provide a much safer approach for families as they cross the road to school.

We hope that parents will appreciate that this change has been made in the interests of pupil safety.
