Romney Marsh Community Church -**Friday Club**


Meets Friday 6 - 7.30pm for children in school years 3 - 6 It's an informal social time for children to join in with fun games and activities and chill together.

Whole School Anti Bully Week

Next week (14/11/16) is National Anti-bullying week. At school children will discuss what bullying is, the different types of bullying and what to do if they think they, or someone else is being bullied.

There will be a number of activities taking place across the school over the next week.

- Monday staff and pupils are invited to come to school in non-Uniform wearing blue to highlight
 how bullying makes you feel. (No charge this day is designed to highlight how bullying makes
 people feel)
- **Tuesday** there will be a Theatre production for KS2 pupils highlighting the issues of bullying. This will be followed by workshop activities.
- Wednesday in assembly we will launch playground buddies to whole school and introduce worry boxes for pupils
- Friday 18th November, we will finish with 'Children in Need' Day and we will be asking for a £1 donation to wear home clothes.

In English learning, children will be looking at books by different authors which highlight the issues of bullying. There will also be a focus on e-safety and the value of being safe online and how to make sure we do not become the victims of online bullying.

Our aim is to make sure St Nicholas is a safe school where all its children are valued. This week is not aimed at children because we feel there is a problem – but rather at making sure this does not become a problem at all.
