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## How to Express Concern and Social Media

In a school with well over 300 children there will be something that happens every day that one of them might not like. It is entirely understandable that children will go home and tell parents and carers about this. Sometimes incidents may have occurred exactly as described by the child but other times the situation might be considerably more complicated.

Please could I ask that if there is something causing you concern, speak to the class teacher in the first instance, or if you feel it is a more serious issue, that you email or ring the school to let us know about it. In almost all cases we will sort the issue out in the first working day after we are told about it and if it will take longer we will keep you informed. The appropriate people to contact are:

- Your child's class teacher
- The School Office – Mrs Clair Seiver & Mrs Hayley Bartlett
- The Family Liaison Officer – Mrs Lisa Baker (for family and welfare issues)
- The Deputy Headteacher – Mrs Dionne Harper

We also ask that you don't go on social media and make public posts about school issues. The school cannot discuss specific issues publicly, so if there is another side to the story that you are not aware of the whole story is not seen by the public which is not fair on individuals concerned. The discussion of any issue by members of the public on social media often degenerates into insults and accusations, sometimes against the school, sometimes against the parents and children in the original post all of which can make dealing with the original issue much harder.

While we do not get every decision right, the staff at the school work with best of intentions and often go above and beyond what I could ever expect them to because they want to help your children. I think that staff and children at the school have the right to privacy and not to find themselves discussed on social media.

Thank you in advance to the vast majority of parents and carers who continue to work with us to support their children.

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
