

Maths Tip Of The Week



Make maths fun and let your children see the point of it in their everyday life. When you play games with the children, give them the chance to add up the totals on their dice on their own; resist the urge to jump in and tell them the total. As your children get older, let them keep score or even be the banker in games like Monopoly. Play card games, Yahzee or Rummicub to encourage

mental arithmetic. On the walk home from school, see who can spot the car registration plate with the highest total. Have fun!
