Attendance: Every day counts: School attendance is vital for young people to reach their full potential. School attendance is a priority for St Nicholas and we will from now on be constantly monitoring pupil attendance. We want to work together with parents/carers to help ensure excellent attendance and punctuality from every pupil. Parents are required by law, to ensure their children attend school regularly. If they fail to do this they are guilty of an offence and may be given a penalty notice or prosecuted under section 444 of the Education Act 1996. The Courts have interpreted regular attendance as 'a child being in school every day it is open for education'. If a child is absent from school without permission, including for a holiday, the parent can be fined by the local authority.


