This will be a very busy term, ensuring the children continue to make developments in their progress and learning. Years 1, 3, 4 & 5 will receive annual reports after Easter with parent consultations taking place in the Summer Term.

I would also like to invite parents to find out more about how we are assessing children in their learning at St Nicholas now the use of levels has been removed by the government. This will allow parents to better understand the changes that are taking place in all schools. (More information below on this.)

We will continue to keep a focus on reading within the school and the progress children are making, but regular support is needed at home with this important life skill as well. The school will be joining the reading bug challenge later this month and there will be rewards and incentives for children to read more regularly, hopefully building on our successes in the reading challenge at the start of the school year.

No doubt, parents will have seen the very recent announcement by the Secretary of State on the importance of multiplication knowledge; hopefully parents will still have the letter I sent out before the holiday outlining our expectations here at St Nicholas. If not, please do ask for another copy.
