I would like to reassure parents and carers that while this process takes place, we will continue to work hard, ensuring that nothing gets in the way of the progress made in improving the quality of teaching and learning.

On Mon 29th Feb they won away against St Augustine's 7-2 and on Mon 7th March they had another decisive win against Christchurch 2-0 at home.
