Dear Parents and Carers,

Over the last few weeks we have sent letters on how to help your child at home with times tables, spellings and how this links to national expectations. This week we will be relaunching Buster's Book Club and reminding children as to how often and for how long they should read at home. For this to be effective and successful it can only be achieved with support from parents.

In a paper recently published in the journal of the Royal Society academics say: "Pupils whose parents take only a limited interest in their learning are far more likely than their peers to drop out of school. It is parents who have the greatest influence on whether or not pupils perform well and stay in school, the research has found". While this research is new I do not find it at all surprising. It is only by working together that children have any opportunity to improve. In light of this, and the information sent home recently, I would like to continue to encourage parents to find the time to support your child at home with their spellings, times tables and reading. I look forward to being able to see many of you at next week's curriculum fayre, where a crèche will be provided for the over 5s.

Over the last few weeks I have noticed that there are many children who do not have appropriate PE kit in school and are not properly dressed for either the lesson or the conditions. Please can I remind parents that PE is part of the curriculum and the expectations that PE uniform guidelines are also adhered to.
