Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back.

I hope the children are all well rested after the half-term break!

This term is already looking as though it will be a very busy term. The dates for the diary are already showing how much is going on at school over the next two weeks. Of the activities listed many are PE related activities. Quite often I am asked by parents 'Why do children need a quality programme of Physical Education?' For me, PE has the following benefits -

- Children learn to understand the importance of exercising for a lifetime.
- Regular physical activity is the best antidote to eliminate obesity and maintain an acceptable body weight. It also provides a positive alternative to watching television or playing on tablets, computers or mobile phones.
- Children learn the fundamental motor skills that enable them to develop the competence that creates confidence and leads to safe and successful participation in a wide range of sports.
- Children are encouraged to improve their fitness levels during PE lessons, including muscular and cardiovascular endurance, strength and flexibility.
- Youngsters can learn valuable lessons about accepting responsibility for their personal development leading to greater self-discipline.
- PE promotes opportunities for children to be creative, cooperative and competitive and to face up to different challenges both as individuals and in groups.

However, if we want our children to achieve all these skills we MUST send them to school properly equipped to take part in PE. All staff have been asked to make sure parents are aware which days their child is taking part in Swimming, PE or any other physical activity. All children are expected to take part in every PE lesson. If there is a health-related reason that prevents a child from taking part in physical exercise, the child's class teacher will need a written note from the parent or carer explaining the circumstances.

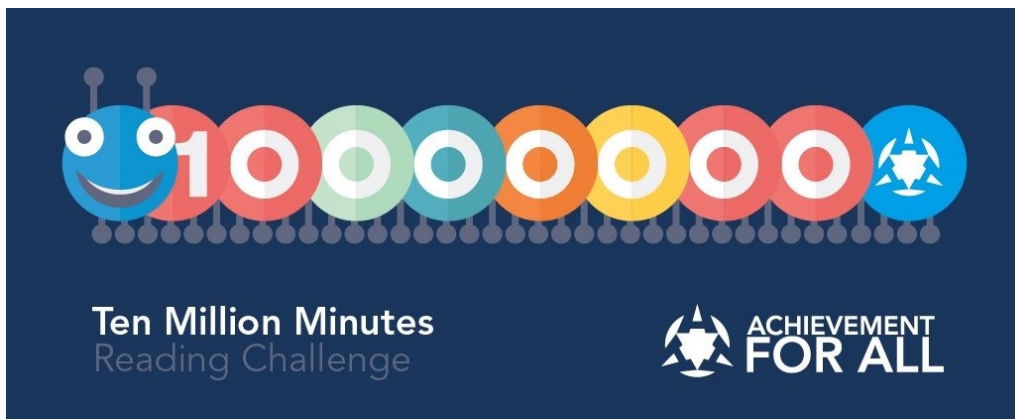
