## Electricity Works - Rolfe Lane, New Romney (Ref 520074406)

On behalf of UK Power Networks I would like to apologies for any inconvenience caused by essential work, necessary to divert High and Low Voltage Cables in Rolfe Lane, New Romney

To carry out this work we will need to close Rolfe Lane to vehicle traffic between the 8<sup>th</sup> January and 19<sup>th</sup> January 2018. There will be a signed alternative route in place during this period. Access will be maintained during the works, but there will be no through route.

During this time we will be diverting cables to facilitate the progression of the new housing development

We will always maintain access to residential properties during our work but inevitably there will be some disruption. Please be assured we will always try to keep any disruption to a minimum and your understanding is very much appreciated.
