Dear Parents and Carers,

Last term staff at St Nicholas attended a training day to improve our English teaching.

The session was very informative and has provided the staff with a lot of practical ideas about improving the teaching of English. The approach known as 'Talk for Writing' (TFW) which was developed by Pie Corbett, is powerful because it's based on the principles of how children learn. It centres on developing children's ability to learn and tell stories, enabling children to imitate the language they need for a topic orally before reading and analysing it and then writing their own version.

These high-quality key texts are learnt as a class - complete with actions - and deeply embedded in every child's working memory. This is then used as a frame on which to innovate and create new and original stories. For those less confident writers this approach gives an increased exposure to the language, plot and rhythm of a successful story. For our more confident writers these stories provide a rich launch pad from which to explore more advanced grammatical structures and develop the love of composing stories.

Already all classes have started a new English unit using this approach. Your child should be able to retell the class story with confidence. Please encourage your child to have a go at retelling the story and let the class teacher know how they get on.

If you received a score of 90% in a test, you would be rightly pleased with your achievement. However, in terms of school attendance, a child with 90% attendance is missing 1/2 a day of school a week. Every week!

If your child is absent from school, you must report their absence by 9am on the first morning. This can be done via Parent Mail under Notify Absence or by telephoning our absence line on **01797 363118** and leaving a message with your child's name, class and reason for absence. <u>Please do not call the school's main number to report absences</u>.
