Dear Parents / Carers

Severe Weather Notice

A Level 3 cold weather alert has been put in place for Kent for the coming week. St Nicholas will endeavour to remain open where possible. Parents/carers have a responsibility to get their child/children to and from school safely and need to decide if the journey is safe when severe weather affects transport links. Parents/carers should inform school if their child is absent from school due to severe weather conditions. If your child has a disability your decision to make the journey must take this into consideration.

If conditions worsen during the school day and parents/carers feel it is absolutely necessary to collect children, the school should be contacted prior to collection.

What can parents do to help?
