For me the most striking quote of the day was 'School needs have to be secondary to the needs of their families; we are trying to engage a community.'

The open and honest dialogue has already produced some positive changes in the school and its day to day systems and I hope this will continue to develop in a way where parents feel they have a strong voice within the school.
