

## E-Safety Announcement regarding 'Fortnite'

Fortnite is a new online game played by many young people.

The game involves 100 players fighting each other in real time to be the final survivor. Whilst the game has a number of fun features there are also risks.

The NSPCC have recently raised concerns over the voice and text chat systems suggesting options in the game are leaving children open to being contacted by strangers.

The NSPCC are advising parents to turn off the voice chat system in the game to ensure children avoid inappropriate contact.

PEGI which considers the age suitability of games have rated this game **suitable for those aged 12 and above**.
