Is my child too ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school when they're unwell. But there are government guidelines for schools that say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't. With the cold wet weather coughs, colds, sore throats and sickness are all around us so it is important that children have a warm coat, hat, scarf and gloves (all named). It's fine to send your child to school with a minor cough or cold.

Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly. You can still send your child to school if they have a sore throat.

Children with diarrhoea or vomiting should stay away from school for 24 hours after their symptoms have gone. If you do keep your child at home it's important to ParentMail the school on the first day to let us know that your child won't be in and give a reason.

Free School Meals

We are currently updating our records to ensure that we have captured the details of all families whose children are entitled to receive Free School Meals.

If you receive any of the benefits below, then your child will be eligible to receive Free School Meals:

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross household income of no more than £16,190)
- The Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Working Tax Credit run on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

If your application for Free School Meals is successful, the school will also receive extra funding from the Government of approximately £1300 per year.

Even if your child already receives a free lunch because they are in Reception or KS1, we can still claim funding to support their learning. If you would like to apply for Free School Meals you can apply online at; <u>https://www.kent.gov.uk/education-and-children/schools/free-school-meals</u>
