#### Important dates for Years 1, 2 and 6

**Year 1** - The Year 1 phonics test will take place during the week beginning 10th June. (Year 2 retakes will also take place during this week).

Year 2 - Year 2 SATs tests will take place during May.

**Year 6** – Year 6 SATs tests will take place during the week beginning 13<sup>th</sup> May. These are National Tests and your child is required to attend school every day during this week.

**Year 4** - The new Year 4 multiplication tables check is due to be taken during the three-week period from 10 June 2019 with the school involved in the pilot this year.

Please avoid making any appointments during these dates. No leave will be authorised for children in these year groups during this time.

#### Break Time Snacks & Birthday Treats

If you are bringing in birthday treats for the class please make sure that they are:

- Nut free
- Individually wrapped (if you bring in a cake, it will need to be pre-cut and ready to hand out to children – we will have to return home if this is not done as teachers don't have the time to organise this)
- Accompanied by all recipe ingredients so that children's allergies can be checked.

Please can I remind parents that snacks being brought into school for break time should be fruit or vegetables only. Cereal bars, sweets and biscuits are not acceptable alternatives.
