

Is my child too ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school when they're unwell. But there are Government guidelines for schools that say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't.

At this time of year we are often confused when a cold can in fact be hayfever. It's fine to send your child to school with a minor cough or cold. Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly. You can still send your child to school if they have a sore throat.
