

## Fantastic Sporting Achievement for the school as children bring home the medals in Cross Country

There was huge success for St. Nicholas Primary Academy at the recent Cross Country Competition at Three Hills Sports Park in Folkestone. The Cross Country competition took place on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> October 2019 as part of the Shepway Sports Trust and Kent School Games.

Against 10 other primary schools and over 100 individual competitors, the Year 3 and Year 4 team for St Nicholas took first place, a huge achievement, with individuals Harry G and Tobella F coming 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> respectively. In year 3 Rose R made her debut on the cross country scene and came a fantastic 4<sup>th</sup> place.

In the Year 5 and 6 group the St. Nicholas Team came third against a field of over 160 competitors from 10 different schools in the area. Individually in this age group Oscar W took 2<sup>nd</sup> and Leo N took 3<sup>rd</sup> place, an amazing achievement against a strong field of competitors.

All 40 children competing from St. Nicholas Primary Academy took a place in the top 30. An amazing result in a competition with over 230 competitors over the age groups. A great performance by and well done to all those who competed.

St. Nicholas CE Primary Academy is very proud of their achievements and have had a lot of success at the competitions held by the Shepway Schools Trust. When asked what the secret to their sporting success their teacher Mrs Arnold commented that is was "due to their commitment and enthusiasm as well as working hard on their fitness."





#### **Football Trials**

Three from St Nicholas CE Primary Academy received the prestigious invitation to the U11 Kent County Trials by Kent Schools' Football Association – see photo above.

Rhys L, Oscar W and Max L are all delighted to have been invited to trial for the Kent Under 11 Primary Squad for the 2019/20 season. Inter-county football is the highest level available to players of this age.
