Dear parents and carers,

Thank you to all the parents who took part in our school questionnaire. Up to the closing date 2/12/19 we have had 59 submissions which is just under 20% of our parent group.

Results were scored out of 5 and each score was colour coded as shown below.







Out of 11 questions parents scored us green in 7 areas, with no reds in any area at all and three scores of 3.9 were achieved in the 4 amber areas. A group from the parent council and I will reflect on the outcomes from the questionnaire and feedback to parents in early January 2020 on all the areas as well as prepare a plan for how we can best address all the issues raised.

At the end of the school year we will repeat the questionnaire again to gauge how well parents feel we have dealt with these issues.

Attendance – Every Day Counts

It is essential that your child comes to school <u>on time</u> every day. Learning begins immediately with Early Morning Work when the class doors open at 8.35am, when many additional interventions are also scheduled for this time, which may include your child.

Children arriving to school after 9am when morning registration has finished receive an unauthorised absence mark for the whole morning. These marks have a huge impact on your child's overall attendance. Can parents please ensure children attend school every day, on time, unless there is a valid reason. Also, doctors, dentist and hospital appointments, if possible, should not be made during school hours or after 1pm to avoid an absence mark.
