

Attendance – Every Day Counts

It is essential that your child comes to school <u>on time</u> every day. Learning begins immediately with Early Morning Work when the class doors open at 8.35am, when many additional interventions are also scheduled for this time <u>which may include your child.</u>

These marks have a huge impact on your child's overall attendance. Can parents please ensure children attend school every day, on time, unless there is a valid reason. Also, doctors, dentist and hospital appointments, if possible, should be made after 1pm to avoid an absence mark
