Attendance – Every Day Counts

It is extremely important that children are on time for school so that they have a settled and productive start to their morning. When children are frequently late for school this adds up to lost learning time.

Arriving 5 mins late every day adds up to over three days lost each year Arriving 15 minutes late every day adds up to two weeks absence a year Arriving 30 minutes late every adds up to nineteen days absence a year Learning begins immediately with Early Morning Work when the class doors open at 8.35am, when many additional interventions are also scheduled for this time which may include your child.

Please be in school on time - lateness affects everyone's learning.
