Subject	Work at home ideas
Reading	<p>Practice the Set 2 and Set 3 sounds – continue to choose a sound a day to practice. Say the sound, write the sound in your books then practice words using the sound. Finally write sentences using those words</p> <p><a href="https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/PicnicOnPluto.html">https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/PicnicOnPluto.html</a> - a fun game – they have to sort real words and alien words</p> <p>Reading- Emperor Penguin reading comprehension – there are two different levels.</p>
Spelling	<p>Choose one set of spellings from the table to practice each day. You could copy them into your books or get someone in your house to test you.</p> <p>Verbs – look at the powerpoint all about verbs. Complete the activities.</p> <p>Remember-verbs are action words. Make a list of verbs on paper or card. Turn over a card, complete the action</p>
English	<p><a href="https://www.literacysshed.com/thewaybackhome.html">https://www.literacysshed.com/thewaybackhome.html</a></p> <p>Watch this short animation and choose from one of the writing tasks to do.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1 – write a story describing the character, setting and what happens at different parts of the story.</li><li>2 – write a list of questions to ask the little boy</li><li>3 – change the story ending</li></ol>
Maths	<p><a href="https://www.prodigygame.com/dashboard/#students">https://www.prodigygame.com/dashboard/#students</a></p> <p>Addition focus – complete the addition activities. Remember when you add two 2 digit numbers together. Draw the tens and ones. Add the ones first, then the tens.</p>
Science	<p>Collect 5 different objects from around your house. Draw and label the object. Describe what it is made of, how it feels and what it is used for. Can you use words like absorb/transparent?</p>

Topic	Design your own quiz using all of the information that you have about the stone age. Then quiz someone in your house to see how much they know about the Stone Age. You could even ask your grown up to send the quiz to me!
PE	<p>Watch Joe Wicks p.e. lesson or find a GoNoodle video to join in with on Youtube.</p> <p>Can you find out the meaning of these words linked to Tennis? You can use the internet and, books or ask someone in your family to find out about the words:</p> <p>Baseline Service Box Serve Backhand Love Deuce Set</p>
Art	Make an animal using recycled materials. Remember when we did this during Science week and we made sea creatures. Who can make the craziest animal? If you can, take a picture and send it to us.
DT	Stone Age children didn't have plastic toys to play with, they would have had to make their own or ask their grown up to make one. Can you try to design your own toy using natural materials?

Music	<p>Can you make your own piece of music which describes a journey through a cave? You could use your voice, natural materials and if you have any instruments around the house.</p> <p>Think about what sounds you might hear, what you would be thinking and what animals you might find on your journey.</p>
RE	Paint a picture of one part of the Easter story or re- create one part using lego or other toys you have at home.
