Dear parents and carers,

Apologies for the delay in sending out this newsletter but we were busy preparing for many of the issues contained within this newsletter and other letters which you will be receiving tonight.

Last week we had another fantastic week of learning here at St Nicholas. The week was full of events across the school with our Science Week starting with an assembly full of surprises. I have included the photos from this and other events at the end of the newsletter.

As parents have become aware we now produce our daily updates with the government response to COVID-19 (Coronavirus) on the Class Dojo pages. We have over 327 parents registered on Dojo but I am aware not everyone accesses their child's class pages. I know this, as I am able to see which families have read each post published.

If we are asked to close the school, CLASS DOJO will be used as a remote teaching platform. Please check that you can access this platform at home and let us know if there are any issues (so we can make sure we're well prepared for remote learning if the school does need to close at some point). Teachers will be sending home access code for everyone who has not signed up to Class Dojo at this time. Please make sure you follow the instructions you are provided or your child will not have access to work for their learning.

We will only close if we are either officially advised to do so or if we don't have enough staff to run the school.

In either case we will:

- Inform parents of this decision by ParentMail or post details on our ClassDojo/School Twitter page
- We will also notify parents via the Kent Schools Closure website (https://www.kentclosures.co.uk)

We will also use these platforms to advise parents when the school has re-opened. Please keep in mind that we're only sending out this information to help the school community prepare. Currently there are no plans to close.

Finally I would ask everyone in our community to make sure they have read the letter sent out this evening and remind everyone if they have any questions they should consult the GOV.UK website for all of the Government's different advice pages.

Attendance – Every Day Counts

It is extremely important that children are on time for school so that they have a settled and productive start to their morning. When children are frequently late for school this adds up to lost learning time.

Arriving 5 mins late every day adds up to over three days lost each year Arriving 15 minutes late every day adds up to two weeks absence a year Arriving 30 minutes late every adds up to nineteen days absence a year Learning begins immediately with Early Morning Work when the class doors open at 8:35am when many additional interventions are also scheduled for this time which may include your child.

School events

As a result of the letters you received today regarding the school response to COVID-19 I am cancelling the Mother's Day Service and the KS1 Mother's Day Celebration in the afternoon of Friday 20th March. I realise this may be upsetting for some but my prime concern is that as a school we must been seen to do everything to protect the well-being and safety of the pupils without putting un-necessary risks in place to the most vulnerable within our setting.

I also have to inform Year 5 parents of the decision to cancel the Year 5 visit to our partner school in Lille, France in line with current Government advice. I apologize for this, but I am sure you will agree this is the best course of action under the current circumstances.

With regard to all other visits, these will be considered on a case by case issue, but if the visit is not considered necessary, then it will not take place.

LENT CHARITIES

During the period of Lent, it is traditional to raise money for Christian charities so they can help and support those in need. School council have met and discussed fun ways in which we can raise money and discussed and voted on the charities they wished to support his year which are The Salvation Army and Operation Noah (a Christian charity that is doing scientific research and campaigning about climate change).
