

Gradiated




Hatching/Linear



Shade using lines that go in the same direction.

- Hair
- Fur
- Grass
















Crosshatching




Shade using over-lapping lines that go in different directions.


- Trees

- Mountains


















Stippling



Shade using short marks and dots.


- Fruit

- Moss

















Gradiated /Blending



Shade using consistent pressure by laying pencil led on side (aka Blending).

- Sky

- Human Skin






















Your Task
