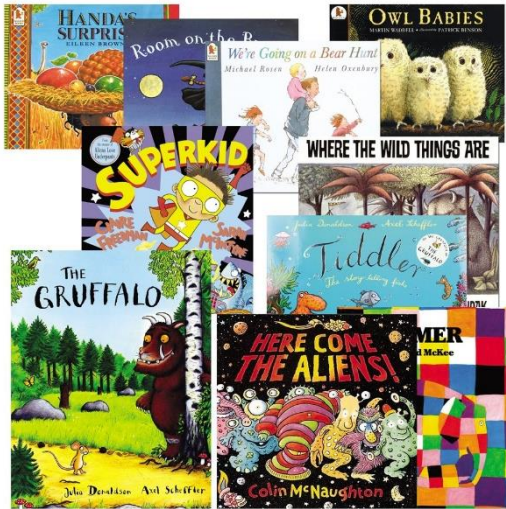


# Early Years – Easter HomeLearning

Design your own Easter egg. You can use pens/pencils/paint or even collage your egg.



Find something in your house or garden that starts with each letter of the alphabet.
