Using words you were given in the first pack have a go at splat the word. When you have splat the word you can keep it. You can also use this method with the phonic sounds that you have.

SIGHT WORDS

Stack



Write the sight words onto some paper or plastic cups and have a go at knocking the words over. You can then read the words that you have knocked off.



Put your sight words onto the stairs and read as you go up to bed?



A fun activity - let the children draw around their hands and then write the words that they are practising onto them. Play high five - put these somewhere that you child passes frequently so that they can 'High Five' and say them each time they pass.
