See if you can retell the story using the story map. Think about what your favorite part of the book is, what parts would you change?</p>
Spelling	<p>Practice spelling words containing the sound of the day from the RWI lesson <a href="https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCo7fbLgY2oA_cFCIq9GdxtQ/featured">https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCo7fbLgY2oA_cFCIq9GdxtQ/featured</a></p> <p>Continue practicing the common exception – hopefully you're getting better at spelling these now!</p> <p>New activity: Look at adding 'er' 'ing' 'ed' to a verb. There is a presentation with some activities on.</p>
English	Continuing the story of Sidney the Spider. See below for daily activities.

Science	<div data-bbox="575 384 770 531" data-label="Image"> </div> <p><b>Spitfire Science</b>  Design and make your own Spitfire. You could make it out of paper, wood, recycled materials, etc. Test out your design. How far does it glide?  <b>Does the material used for a paper plane affect the distance it travels?</b> Try using newspaper, card, tinfoil, etc and carry out a test. Remember, only change ONE thing to make it a fair test.</p>
Topic	<p>Find out about the town and countryside. There is a presentation going through the story 'The town mouse and the country mouse' and then it has some pictures of things you find in the town and countryside. Talk about whether you live in a town or the countryside. How do you know? You could take a walk around the local area to see if you can find things from the presentation. What things can be found in a town and the countryside? Discuss other towns and countrysides.</p>

<b>Activity</b>	Write about the mini beast hunt you went on last week or go on another hunt and write about that one. See the template for support. <b>Challenge:</b> Can you write the re-count all by yourself using the key words?	Like the fact file you created about spiders, research a mini beast of your choice. This could be one you found in your garden or walk. What does it look like? Where does it live? What else can you find out about your mini beast?	Using the facts you found out about your mini beast yesterday, create your own information booklet or sheet about it.  Can you include: headings, sub-heading, pictures? Don't forget to write in sentences and try and do as much as possible all by yourself.	 <p><b>'Stay At Home' Street Party</b></p> <p>Share this article on <a href="#">Newsround</a> with your family and look closely at the photographs. <b>How did people celebrate in 1945?
