-ing, -er, and -ed Endings

We can change the verb by adding different endings to them.



jump+ing = jumping

jump+er = jumper

Read each word to your grown up and draw a picture for each one. Can you put them both into a sentence? You can write these down if you wish or practice saying your sentence out loud. Try adding -ed to jump.

jump+ed

Can you say a sentence with jumped in?

-ing, -er, and -ed Endings

Add -ing, -ed or -er to jump so the sentences make sense.

I love the new jump___ Gran gave me.

Kate was jump___ on her bed and it broke.

The children jump___ on the trampoline.

ing

ed

er

When a word ends in a digraph (special friend) such as ck or zz, just add the ending on.

buzz +

ed

ing

er



Watch Out!

Sometimes it sounds like there is an extra **syllable** or **beat** in a word when ed is added...

Remember what you've learnt about 'ed' endings.

Here's a re-cap if needed:

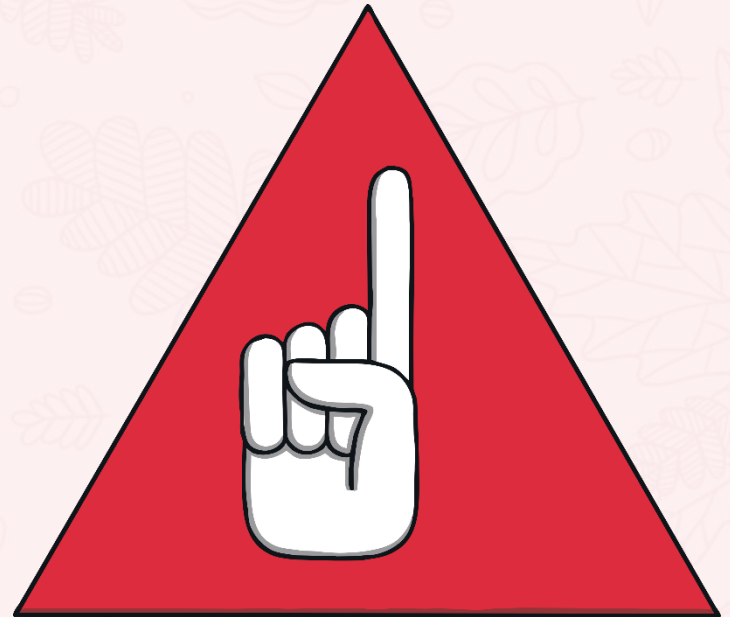

wanted

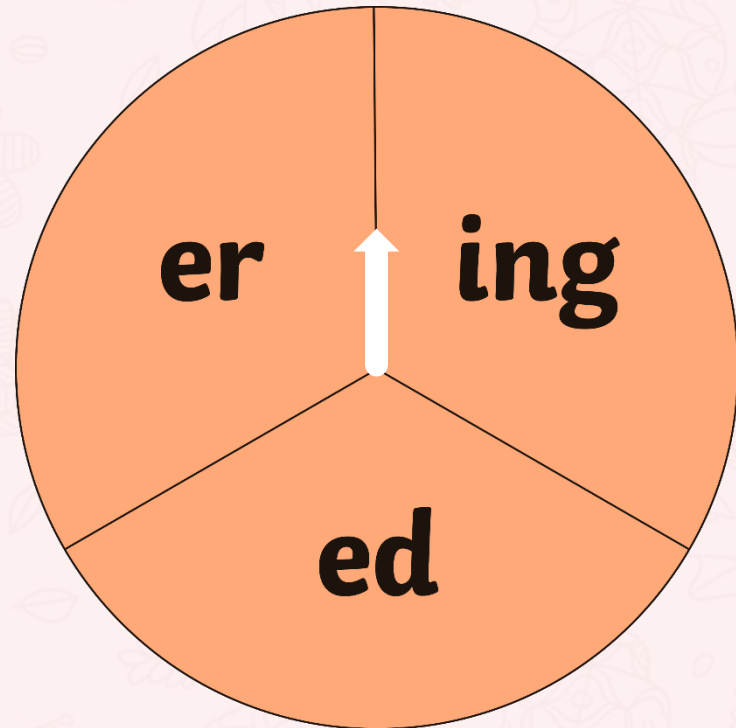
planted
