#### Online learning

This will be available to parents again from **Monday 20<sup>th</sup> April** – please go to the Year Group Pages on the school website and look at Class Dojo for instructions from your class teacher.

We are really sorry but we are not able to supply work in hard copy and we know how difficult this is for some families.

When working with your child, be realistic about what you can do

- You're not expected to be teachers and your children won't learn as they do in school. Providing your children with some structure will help them to adapt.
- As you get back into a routine, experiment, then take stock. What's working and what isn't? Ask your children, involve them.
- Share the load if there are 2 parents at home. Split the day into 2-3 hour slots and take turns so you can do your own work
- Take care of your own health and wellbeing. This is still a new way of living for your entire household, so find time to have fun and play games together.
