## - ABLE/ABLY —IBLE/IBLY

Able is more common than ible

Able is usually used when the root word can be heard before it – adore / adorable

In some cases, the ending of the root word may change – rely/reliable
Ible is more common if a complete root word cannot be heard before it – possible

When you add --ibly or --ably, you drop the e from the end of the word before adding the suffix. LESSON SIX Focus: -Able/Ably Ible/Ibly Practise Choose from the strategies at the start (pyramid, drawing, rainbow writing) to learn the ible/able words.
