| English | <p>Read the poem 'The Rubbish Tip Alien' together.</p> <p>Come up with actions to help you remember the poem, like we do at school.</p> <p>Can you draw your own Rubbish Tip Alien? What things might you use for different parts of their body.</p> <p>Can you draw their home? What might their furniture be made from?</p> | <p>Rhyming Words</p> <p>Can you cross out the word that doesn't rhyme?</p> <p>Remember we are looking at the sound at the end of the words to see if they rhyme.</p> <p>Remember that some sounds have different spellings, they might not have the same letters in the words, but the words still might rhyme.</p> | <p>Look again at the picture of the Rubbish Tip Alien. This time we are going to look at where he lives. This is called the setting.</p> <p>Can you describe the different parts of the setting using 'What Like' words (adjectives)?</p> <p><b>Challenge</b> – can you think of some similes for the parts of the setting?</p> <p>A simile is when you compare something to something else to describe it. For example, you might say that the sun is as yellow as a banana.</p> | <p>Can you write your own version of the Rubbish Tip Alien? Use the sentence starters to help you.</p> <p>You might want to look back at the picture you drew of your own Rubbish Tip Alien and write your poem about them instead.</p> <p>Remember to use 'What Like' words (adjectives) to make your poem more interesting.</p> |
