Dear Parents and Carers,

Earlier this week the Prime Minister announced that the country will move to Step 3 of the roadmap for the easing of lockdown from Monday 17<sup>th</sup> May.

As a result, from Monday, the following changes will be made to the school's risk assessment.

- Parents will no longer have to wear face masks when dropping off and collecting children. We would however appreciate it if you would continue to support us with social distancing measures as not all adult age groups will have been able to have received their first or second vaccination.
- Face coverings will no longer be recommended for staff in classrooms. However, following government guidance, we will continue to recommend that face coverings should be worn by staff and visitors in situations outside of classrooms where social distancing is not possible.
- Windows and doors will continue to remain open to promote good air flow in shared spaces.
- Good hand hygiene will continue to be promoted to all within the school community.
- Lateral Flow Testing for all staff will continue
- Despite the announcement that schools can now have educational visits, we will not have any school trips other than the outdoor residential for Year 6. While the government has acknowledged trips can take place, the processes we have to follow are far too burdensome at this time for us to consider any trips to be practical. I do realise this may be disappointing for some of you, but when I consider we are one of a very few schools in our district not to have bubbles collapse I feel we have the correct approach.

As a school we have always worked hard to ensure we do what is safest and appropriate for all in our community when following the guidance and I would like to thank everyone for their hard work in our desire to remain a Covid safe environment.
