Kabloom seedbombs

New Romney Town Council have supplied Kabloom seedbombs for every family and these will be going home with your child today. The pots contain seeds of flowers specially designed for bees.



Put a little bit of water inside, shake and then throw this bomb where you want to grow some flowers. While the bomb biodegrades, the seeds inside bloom and flourish into a marvellous collection of wildflowers. These types of flowers that grow are ones that are full of tasty nectar; perfect for bumblebees and honey bees.

Seeds included are; Cornflower, Vipers, Bugloss, Wild Marjoram, Red Clover, Borage, Phacelia.
