School Lunches


As parents are aware we have our own 'in house' catering provision. The quality and standard of the meals is exceptionally high and we spend more on the food provision than any of the main catering suppliers.

Last week we served on average 248 meals a day, which is mind blowing. A big well done to Mrs Lucas our Catering Manager and her team and now have our own 'in-house' provision.

The charge for a pupil meal remains at £2.25 per day. All meals must be paid for in advance on a Monday. This can be paid weekly, monthly, half termly or termly in advance. Payments can be made online through your ParentMail account select Payments > Shop > St Nicholas School Lunch. If a pupil misses meals then any credits will be carried forward. We are a cashless Academy, so we are unable to take any cash payments. Remember - if your child has packed lunches you can book for our popular food days on Wednesdays; roast day and Friday; fish and chip day.

Class Dojo

At St Nicholas we use Class Dojo to keep in touch with you about school events, send reminders and send celebratory messages about learning and community activities.



Some of the features include:

- Class Story general class news and celebrations, reminders and updates.
- School Story news from across the school, on the day it happens, informing you about whole school events and other whole school information and updates.

Now the new school year has started many parents will need to log back in to their Dojo Account to be able to see their child's new class. If you have not already done this we suggest you log out and then sign back in, that way the system will find your child's new class.

House Captains

Children have now voted for their Year 6 House Captains. Amongst various responsibilities of showing guests around the school and meeting with Governors, the children will also collect and collate House Points on a weekly basis. House Points are awarded for excellent learning and effort but also for manners and demonstrating the St Nicholas way.
