Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year! A warm welcome back to school and to all those families who have joined us at the start of this term.

Are you making a resolution in the new year? Warning: More than half of all resolutions fail, but this year, they don't have to be yours. Quite often, with a new year comes 'the turning of a new leaf.'

I spoke with the children at the start of the week about how adults are often motivated to make the changes they've been talking about all year long and how sometimes our new starts are not always as easy as they should be.

This year I would like to ask **all** parents at our school to engage in a new year's resolution of a different kind. One in which I would like **all** parents make a commitment to supporting their child in reading, no matter which year group they are in.

I would like to create a community in which all children are reading their way to a better life. Research shows that reading for pleasure can promote better health and wellbeing, aids in building social connections and relationships with others and is associated with a range of factors that help increase the chances of social mobility.



A child with good reading habits is more likely to succeed in education than those who do not. To support parents, we have a variety of events at the start of the school year to assist parents in supporting their child as a way of developing these new habits.

The start of our new year of reading has seen the following put in place;

- Library cards for children
- Adult education courses for parents
- Online support videos for parents these are available on Class Dojo from today and the links are available for the next 10 days.
- Parent Teacher sessions, our next planned events are for Year 2
 & Year 6 on 13th January see Class Dojo for further information.

One of our core aims at St Nicholas has been to ask parents to listen to children read at least 4 times a week for 10 to 15 minutes a time. My question is, is this really too much to be able to support children?

Mrs Starmer-Smith is Head of Inclusion here at St Nicholas.



As SENCo she coordinates the provision for children with additional needs and is Designated Teacher for Looked after Children. She is also Designated Safeguarding Lead for the school. Since taking on her role, Mrs Starmer-Smith has improved provision and outcomes for children with additional needs here at St Nicholas. She has secured extra funding, which has enabled us to employ additional staff to directly

support our children. As part of the Senior Leadership Team, she influences all decisions relating to Special Educational Needs. Mrs Starmer-Smith is currently using her expertise to support another school locally with their SEND provision. Over her 17 years in education, she has been particularly passionate about improving outcomes for children with autism and has training in this area in addition to lived experience.

Mrs Starmer-Smith also has a play therapy background and a clear understanding of the importance of wellbeing and supporting the whole child and family. She is excited to be involved in our current project which will result in our new Specialist Resourced Provision (SRP) opening in September 2022 this year!


WE NEED YOU!

Free School Meals Support

We have been informed that Kent County Council will continue to support children eligible for Free School Meals with food vouchers throughout the holiday periods until **Easter 2022.**

If you believe your child may be eligible for free school meals and you get any of the following benefits, please apply on line at www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/kent/

If your child/children are already eligible and receiving free school meals you do not need to reapply. If you are not sure whether your child/children are on the school's free school meal list please contact the School Office who will be able to assist you.

- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- Income Support
- · income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit.

The benefits at the moment are not just for school meals – vouchers are available to families during the school holidays and over the Christmas period this year families were able to get support for them and children with public transport. There may also be support for families who register with summer holiday clubs in the future.
