Homophobic Language

Over the past week, we have had an issue with a small number of pupils openly using homophobic language. When challenged, pupils believe they are having fun at the expense of others, and they believe that it is just banter! This is not banter and has no place in our school, nor society.

This unacceptable behaviour is also outlined in the governments Keeping Children Safe in Education (September 2022) guidance, it is part of every school Safeguarding Policy, and that involves protecting pupils from physical harm, but also includes harm to their mental health and protecting pupils from discriminatory bullying etc.

The impact of "banter" or the deliberate use of discriminatory language/behaviour on our pupils and society can be catastrophic and have lifelong effects.

I would be grateful if parents would discuss these issues with your child/ren - challenge "banter" or the use of inappropriate discriminatory language/behaviour.
