### Dear parents and carers,

It's been a busy week at St Nicholas. I have loved seeing the learning which has taken place across the school this week. Whether it was the lovely Ascension Day service with the Year 2 & 3 children yesterday, the Year 6 on their Geography trail along New Romney High Street, or seeing the awe and wonder that exists on the face of the children when doing something new for the first time.

Reading - One of the things I have

asked parents to help us with, is for support in reading regularly with your child. This will ensure they will be able to develop their fluency and speed in their reading. In school we have reading sessions every day and the adults in the school are working hard to ensure that all children are heard reading daily on top of their teaching. We have already seen great improvements but if we want this to be really successful we do need your support at home.

**Headlice** - The presence of head lice in schools is an uncomfortable fact of life. The cooperation of all parents is sought in helping to ensure this nuisance does not become a great problem.

It is extremely important for you to check your child's head for head lice **TODAY**. If you do find head lice, commence treatment immediately and be sure to complete the process of treatment. This will help prevent head lice from spreading. Remember to keep checking your family member's heads every 2 days until there are no head lice found for 10 consecutive days. For further information regarding treating head lice, refer to the <u>Department of Health's Head Lice fact sheet</u>. Your local pharmacist can provide advice regarding head lice treatment options and headlice combs.


