Dear parents and carers,

This week I met with the Governing Body. In the meeting we reflected on our successes this year including looking at the school's results.

In EYFS, 75% of our children achieved a Good Level of Development compared to a previous national result of 63%. In Year 1, 90% of our children achieved the Expected Standard for Phonics.

In KS1, 83% of pupils achieved the Expected Standard in Reading, compared to the national result of 69%. In Writing 61% of pupils nationally reached the Expected Standards. At St Nicholas, pupils achieved an outcome of 64.4%. In Maths, the school achieved 73% in our KS1 Maths results marginally above the national of 72%.

In KS2, our Year 6 pupils achieved 82% in their Writing against a national result of 71%. In Reading 26% of pupils were judged to be working at the higher standard, with 18% at the higher standard in Writing. In PESE (11+) outcomes, 25% of our Y6 children also achieved the threshold for a grammar school this year.



I am also pleased to report we achieved the Gold School Games Mark award for the 4th year, for our commitment & engagement in the School Games for 2022/23.

Our successes can be seen in areas such as the Herald Cup in which the boys team reached the semi-finals and the girls team made it to final in the first ever Girls Herald Cup tournament. The school had many stand out

performances in various individual events, with the school coming 3<sup>rd</sup> in the District Sports competing against schools across Folkestone, Hythe & the Romney Marsh. I am pleased the school continues to maintain a very high standard in sport as well.

Last night I was proud watch the Year 6 production of Oliver Twist. It was a joy to see so many children have the confidence to sing and act individually on stage. As one parent commented to me "it's testament as to how safe the children feel at the school to sing and act in the way they did."

This evening Year 4 pupils will take part in the JAM on the Marsh Music Festival, having the opportunity to perform with nationally recognised Opera singers and a professional orchestra. Dedication comes in many forms and the children taking part in this project have been working all year towards this event. I and your parents who have supported you, are looking forward to the performance.

This is the last newsletter of the school year. I would like to wish you all a very good summer break - have a lovely weekend.

## **SUMMER HAF – Holiday Activities & Food Programme**


