It has been a very busy week at St Nicholas this week. A big thank you to all the parents who have joined Mrs Lilly and other members of the school team for our reading workshops. Over the course of the last week, as part of our '*Arts week*' the children have been following the theme of being an architect. I am looking forward to inviting parents into school, to join us for an exhibition of the children's work when its complete.

This week we celebrated the start of Black History Month in school. This is an annual event, each October, honouring the contributions and accomplishments of the Black British community in our everyday lives in the UK. It celebrates both current and historical individuals and the positive impact they have made to our society.

Black History Month provides great opportunities to highlight key moments in Black history around the world and in Britain. It is important to celebrate the contributions of everyone to our society and support the multi-culturalism and diversity that helps shape our communities.

In our assembly this week we spoke about Famous Black people who shaped our lives. I shared with the children how I was inspired as a young teenager by West Indian cricketer, Sir Viv Richards. While other staff members shared who had inspired them. Mr Houghton spoke of Olympian, Daley Thompson; Miss Welsh spoke about Michelle Obama as a role model for young people; Mrs Lee spoke of U.S. President, Barak Obama as a role model and force for good; Mrs Bader said she had been inspired by Dame Kelly Holmes, while Mr Dewey spoke about Jessie Owens, an American athlete in the 1930s who raced at the Munich Games. We also looked at people who changed the lives of others such as Rosa Parks and Nelson Mandela.



Uniform

I would like to thank you all our parents who make sure their children arrive at school in the proper school uniform (and label items). We are really proud of our school uniform and expect all children to wear it. However, I have noticed increasing numbers of children who are not wearing correct school uniform—mainly this is children forgetting what's allowed and what isn't, or neglecting to come to school with a PE kit. Furthermore, our expectations around uniform extends to jewellery, below is a reminder of the uniform and expectations for ALL our children.

- Footwear with uniform should be black, practical school shoes not trainers.
- PE kit is a plain white t-shirt with blue plain shorts and an optional plain track suit NO football kits allowed.
- If ears are pierced, only one pair of studs may be worn for safety reasons. Ideally, these should not be worn on PE days, but if they cannot be removed, they must be covered up with tape which each child should keep in their PE bag.
- Socks and tights should be plain.
- No jewellery (except watches), no nail varnish or make up.

I have reminded the school of our rules and class teachers will re-enforce our message to maintain high standards.
