- To give simple reasons why Jesus told the story of the Good Samaritan.
- To identify how different religions care for others.
- To explain the Jewish practice of Tzedakah.
- To identify the Golden Rule and what might happen if people followed this idea more.

We will also tell the story of the birth of Jesus and recognise the link with incarnation – Jesus is the 'God on Earth'.

Science Objectives

- Children will be observing closely, using simple equipment.
- Can they perform simple tests?
- Can they identify and classify different materials?
- Can they gather and record data to help in answering questions?
- Can they compare how things move on different surfaces?
