I hope all our families had a good half term break last week. It is good to see the children getting back into routines very guickly.

This week we have already had the first of our Parent Teacher consultations, with the remainder taking place next week. Many parents will have had feedback on how their child may improve in different areas of the curriculum. One area of focus for us as a school is to continue to develop pupils writing. To help achieve this, we will be introducing *SUAVE* words every week to support pupils' development of vocabulary skills.

Suave words are used to broaden vocabulary as well as help with reading and writing. Starting next week children will complete activities in class to learn the spelling of the new *Suave word* and all pupils and staff will be encouraged to use the word when talking as much as possible.

Pupils will receive a weekly task via ClassDojo so that parents can support their child with a Talk Homework task where families will be encouraged to write a definition of the new word and to put the word in context into a sentence. We hope you will support your child with this learning.

Parent governor election

There is **currently a vacancy for a parent governor** on the governing body, and an election will take place shortly. Any parent who is elected must have a child at the school at the time of the election, but may continue to serve as a governor for 4 years if he or she wishes, even if his or her child leaves school during that time.

Being a parent governor requires time, energy and commitment. The role provides **strategic support for the school**. Parent Governors are very important in the life of the school: they need a strong commitment to improving outcomes for children, the inquisitiveness to question and analyse. You will need some time to offer during the day and in the evening and a willingness to learn. Training is available as are expenses for your travel to this training.

The main thing needed is a passion for making a real difference to our community. Your child will come home with the letter and application form this afternoon. If you are interested, please do not hesitate to speak to me, or any of the governors at the school if you would like to know more about the role.


