$$1 \times 12 = 12$$

$$2 \times 12 = 24$$

$$3 \times 12 = 36$$

$$4 \times 12 = 48$$

$$5 \times 12 = 60$$

$$6 \times 12 = 72$$

$$7 \times 12 = 84$$

$$8 \times 12 = 96$$

$$9 \times 12 = 108$$

$$10 \times 12 = 120$$

$$11 \times 12 = 132$$

$$12 \times 12 = 144$$

Top Tips

The secret to success is practising little and often. Use time wisely. Can you practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey?

You don't need to practise them all at once: - perhaps you could have a fact family of the day. If you would like more ideas, please speak to your child's teacher.

Double your 6 times table – Multiplying a number by 12 is the same as multiplying by 6 and then doubling the answer.

7 × 6 = 42 Double 42 is 84 so, 7 × 12 = 84
