




Attendance every day counts.

Children in Need Day - Friday 15th 2024



We are delighted to share that our Sponsored Bounce has so far raised well over £2451.85, if you have any outstanding funds at home please send these in as soon as possible.



Do you notice anything?


What do you notice?

Can you find a way through in which the numbers add to exactly 100?




What is the lowest number you can make going through the maze?


