

Search Engines

Hopefully you will have seen our #WakeUpWednesday post on ClassDojo on Wednesday all about search engines. Most of us will use a search engine every day when searching for information online.

The top ten search engines of 2024 were:

As you can see, Google is the number 1 search engine by over 87%! With the amazing results these search engines bring, they also pose a risk to our children unless they are properly supervised. They can easily encounter misleading, inappropriate, or even illegal content. At St Nicholas, the children use <u>Kiddle - visual search engine for kids</u> which uses the power of Google searches, but in a far safer way. Another child-focused search engine is <u>Swiggle.org.uk - Child Friendly Search Engine for Kids</u> which also harnesses the power of Google, but in a child friendly way.

Mobile phones and social media



This week Mr Dale sent out a letter to parents of pupils in Y5 and 6 who have a mobile phone, informing parents that like all schools, we have incidents relating to pupil misuse of mobile phones. These range from inappropriate name calling, to swearing at each other, along with potential bullying an on occasions the sharing of explicit images, all of which is wrong, and we wish to support parents in managing. Most young people use devices safely and without repercussion, but we know that this does not mean that others do not target them or use such platforms to cause harm.

In the main, <u>these incidents occur outside of the school day on mobile phones provided by</u> <u>you as parents and carers</u>. However, our pastoral and safeguarding teams are having to manage the repercussions of these behaviours in school, some of which have led to police reports and Children's Social Services referrals. We take these matters seriously and will always involve the police where the action is of a criminal or threatening nature. Where the police choose not to act, the school will do so in line with our policies.

When **you** provide your child/children with mobile devices, **you** have a duty of responsibility as parents/carers, to ensure that you set appropriate parental controls that restrict the content available to your child, and that you frequently check your children's devices, which includes smart TVs and games consoles, as well as mobile phones and tablets, to ensure that you know who they are in contact with and what they are doing online.



On **Thursday 8th May we will be celebrating the 80th anniversary of VE Day** at St Nicholas School.

We would ask that children come to school dressed in **red**, white & blue on the day. We will start with an outdoor worship around our flagpoles where children will join in worship and sing the songs of the wartime period.

There will be a lunchtime street party - details have already been sent out to everyone on this. In the afternoon children will be taking part in making some war time crafts to remember the event.
